Think about how you can broaden your success personally and professionally. Your district leaders are eager to assist you in any way possible!

From the Club Growth Director...



We have just completed the first of three membership campaigns (Smedley Award) this program year. In Toastmasters, membership growth is a constant ebb and flow. That can sometimes be very frustrating for clubs trying to build and sustain a membership base.

So, what do we do?

We pass out more brochures and fliers, write a news release, or even have a radio station broadcast a public service announcement. These are great tools for increasing membership, but sometimes we overlook the basics.

All Toastmasters clubs must strive to conduct quality meetings. A club that is consistently having quality meetings will enhance the member experience. When the members' needs are met, that will lead to higher retention and a healthier club. One of the best tools to determine if your club is having a quality meeting is *The Moments of Truth* from The Successful Club Series" modules. This module should be presented at least once per year or even **twice** per year. The very first category is "First Impressions". Please take a long hard look and ensure that your club is strong in this area. Is the club enthusiastically greeting guests and enrolling them in the Toastmasters' vision? One of the best ways to ensure that guests are properly enrolled is to read through "Befriend a Guest" in Project 7 of the Competent Leadership manual. Also, make sure that branded materials are displayed at every meeting, such as the club banner, ballots, table tents, lectern, and members are wearing their Toastmasters pins. When a guest shows up to a meeting, there should be no doubt that he or she is at a Toastmasters meeting! Scrutinize the remainder of the module and come up with a strategy (Club Success Plan) to correct areas that are not as strong. The next time your club discusses membership growth, ensure that the club is growing from the inside out.

Good news, fellow Toastmasters: We've started this year off strong! We already had our first in-person exhibition event, the St. Louis World's Fare Heritage Festival in August. The District Trio and a few other Toastmasters came along to help me get the word out to the public about the great work we do. 

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District 8 Proxy Certificate District Council Meeting

For Presidents and Vice Presidents Education

At the district council business meeting, each club president and vice president education in attendance is entitled to one vote. However, if both officers cannot attend, they may designate, in writing, any other active member of their club to act as proxy for their club. (*use form below*). No other proxy is valid at this meeting – per Article X, Paragraph (d) of the District Administrative Bylaws.

In the event one of these officers does not attend the meeting and has not designated, in writing, an active member of the club to act as his or her proxy, the officer or proxy holder in attendance is deemed to hold the proxy of the other, and may therefore cast two votes at the meeting. This assures that every club is represented by two votes. Proxy holders or club presidents/VPEs are limited to a maximum of two votes each.

They are on a tight time schedule and need to get this done promptly. Area Director visits are a benefit to your club members; they can provide inspiration, excitement, and, at times, a gentle nudge in the right direction, to help you stay on track to completing your goals.

<u>Communicating Real World Issues and Finding</u> <u>Resolutions:</u> During District Leader meetings, the area directors have a session where they share what is happening in their areas, specifically, the challenges of their clubs and their star clubs.

Strategic Planning Meeting: In another meeting that includes the division directors and the Trio, we take the data shared at the district leader meeting and put the items into action. Taking it to that next step allows area directors to continue looking deeper into their clubs and be on point for them. It also shows you we really care! Be on the lookout for communications and exciting things happening in the district over the next few months.

That is all for now. My hope is that when you read and learn about what **we** are doing, you will make this **your** mission. Take that extra step in bringing club quality for your members and yourself! Celebrate the good times and your members' progress. Top Talk Toastmasters!

Past District 8 Director, Farzana Chohan, Receives Presidential Citation by Eileen Smith-Murphy, CC, ALB

Among the many exciting stories to come back to us from the recent Toastmasters International Convention in Vancouver was the news that Past District 8 Director Farzana Chohan, DTM, was awarded one of the organization's highest honors: the Presidential Citation. This award, selected and bestowed directly by the International President, recognizes individuals who have made outstanding efforts in support of the mission and values of Toastmasters over a significant length of time.

No one who knows her would deny that Farzana embodies these criteria. A Toastmaster for seven years, Farzana has served in several club and district offices, published several books about Toastmasters and District 8, and shown unwavering dedication to helping people improve themselves through evolving as leaders. In an interview after the convention, I asked Farzana to share a little bit about the experience.

Can you describe the experience of receiving your award? "I'm standing there, and I'm looking at the hall, which has close to three thousand people, and I'm looking at the stage, which is really long. At the top of the stage in the background, there are huge screens. When you look at the screen, and look at the image on the screen when you're standing on the stage – really, you look very tiny. So I am standing there and I'm looking at it, and I had this sort of pride and excitement for myself. Because before that, since I heard the news, I didn't – I was like, 'Yeah, okay, this is not real.' But when you stand there and you're looking at all the people receiving awards, on this huge stage and in front of so many people, it gets to you!"



Were there any particular achievements you were cited for or that helped you to earn this award? I kind of compare the energy of the members in the district when I joined. I was able to see the potential of the Toastmasters, and I see the enthusiasm in some of the experienced members, but I never feel that enthusiasm in our newer members or other members of corporate clubs. And I think what motivated me to become a leader...was to bring back the energy which was there before. In my perception, I think I was able to energize members of the district more...I wanted everyone to work together and re-energize members about what Toastmasters actually is."

Has earning this award affected how you see your future in Toastmasters? "Yes. I think the benefits I have received as being a member of Toastmasters—and what it has done for me, in terms of giving me confidence, and gaining more confidence in my leadership skills—I want to give this to younger people, and people who aren't in Toastmasters..."

Do you have any words of wisdom to share with District 8? "Being a 76/77-year-old district, we have a lot ingrained in us, and we also have a very protective style of operating, where we want to safeguard whatever is remaining. But to walk with the changing world, we need to shift the way we work, and we need to include *all* other generations. And we need to understand it from their point of view. Unless we bring new blood in, we will not be able to sustain anything, which, in turn, will result in a lot of people losing a chance to develop themselves."

Farzana also made a point of giving credit to those who helped her along the way: "I think it was the collective work of everyone who worked with me in the district and in my Toastmasters life have been friends with me and have been my mentors. And I thought about all of them."

Kat Mokriakow Receives the Excellence in Program Quality Award

Each year Toastmasters International bestows an award to the Program Quality Director when the district achieves its goals for Distinguished Clubs. At this past convention, Kat Mokriakow received this award for leading District 8 with **43** clubs reaching distinguished, select, and president's distinguished statuses. "I was really surprised when I saw there were two brand new clubs that reached distinguished club status. They are an inspiration to me that says *anything* is possible when you really want it. Thank you to **all** District 8 members, for your commitment and dedication to helping others and yourselves."
