Life is a Journey – this phrase was my mantra this year. When life got too hectic, I would pause, find my patience and remind myself to be present. Consciously choosing to slow down was a lifestyle adjustment that I felt called to last March. As an only child, I always knew that I would need to go home and be with my parents in their last days. For the past twenty-five years, I watched over them from afar. I heard how their friends and neighbors helped them as they aged. My parents were pioneers in the isolated hills of the Ozarks; they created a community-centered life. Their community gave back to them, but I knew the time had come for me to go home. I needed to take care of them, learn about their daily needs, slow down and be present for them.



At the Toastmaster leadership trainings in August and January, I shared this goal --- To be present. I thought of it as simply relearning my listening skills. Put my wishes and desires on hold; listen intently to friends and family -- so intently that the look on their faces expressed understanding. This included understanding my parents. Those “end of life” discussions with my parents seem surreal and precious now that my father passed away two months ago. I am thankful that he knew I understood him.

Grief is a pathway that we will all someday travel. What I learned is that “being present” is an approach to grief that heals the pain. My Toastmaster’s personal goal helped me to deal with the deepest pain that I have ever experienced. While this path is common to all, no one can tell you exactly how to deal with grief. Your Toastmasters journey will teach you how.

Understanding how to grieve prepares us for our loss and its pain. We are human, and it is in our nature to create connections. Breaks or losses in our connections produce pain. Pain is grief. Viewing our own grief or pain as something that enables us to help others is not a perspective that comes at the beginning of the grief process. However, Toastmasters gives us a head start on this grieving process.

I found comfort in the March Toastmaster magazine’s Member Moment about Toastmaster Jay Fagnano. Joe’s Ice Breaker at his club in Los Angeles made people cry. His speech told the story of his son’s death. Jay said, “Toastmasters allowed me to work through some of my grief through the speeches I gave. I opened myself up to some very raw emotions and the group allowed me to go places with my sorrow that I hadn’t been able to express before.”

Seeing my Toastmaster’s journey through my own tears of grief has given me a new perspective. I feel more deeply connected and my hope restored. My friends, because of you, my grief opened my eyes to the importance of giving back with empathy and compassion. It renewed my life’s journey and reaffirmed my commitment to enjoy every moment. I look forward to being present with you, hearing you, feeling your emotions and understanding you. At the upcoming conference, let’s find a quiet place to talk and listen. If this is your first time at a Toastmaster master event, let’s get to know each other. If you are an old friend, let’s catch up. I’d love to hear about your life, your goals and your next steps in your Toastmaster journey. ▲

You are invited by a friend to attend their Toastmasters meeting. You never heard of Toastmasters before, but hey you are game-your friend said it is an open house, and well, there's going to be food. You had a hard day at work and actually don't feel like cooking tonight, so why not!

When you enter the door you are greeted warmly and that makes you feel good, but you are also thinking, "Oh boy, what did I get myself into?" As the meeting progresses, you begin to see and hear things that make sense to you, and for the first time realize this Toastmasters club thing can help your career at work. Why you can just see yourself leading the next business meeting with poise and confidence. At the end of the meeting, someone who says they are the Vice President Membership asks you to join and hands you an application. Without hesitation, you take out your pen, fill in the blanks, and hand over your credit card. Just like that! Snap! You are now a member of the club.

"Now what?" you ask yourself. The next thing you know someone called the Vice President Education comes over and asks you to sign up to give your first speech, the Ice Breaker. You instantly let her know you are not ready, that you just joined and want to sit back and just attend a few meetings, get your feet wet, and see how it goes. However that is not what happens. Every time you come to a meeting, someone asks you if you can be a Timer or the Ah Counter. Hmm, this isn't so bad, you feel can do this with no problem. I can count how many times other people say um-oops there's one for me!

Now it is a year later and you finally got the nerve to give your first speech. It went very well and your evaluator was very kind in giving you some feedback. The Vice President Education keeps asking you when you are going to give your next speech. Maybe later is your standard reply. "I am so busy at work" or "there's so much going on there isn't time to write a speech" are the excuses you give to the club. You are still attending the meetings regularly and feel you are contributing to the club by filling the functionary roles. As time goes on, things get hectic and you are busier than ever. Next thing you know, you are missing meeting after meeting. Soon thereafter, you drop the club completely and let them know you will return when you have more time, but you never do.

This is a problem that clubs all over the world face. Members begin their journey at a Toastmasters club with high expectations and visions of what they can learn and do as a part of their membership. However, things get in the way. Ideals get lost or put aside for an indefinite period of time. Believe it or not, folks do not join Toastmasters clubs so they can be great ah counters or timers, however many end up completing these roles over and over and put off speaking in the club. Since they are not getting what they came to Toastmasters for in the first place, they eventually drop the club.

So what do we do? In looking at the example above the woman joined a Toastmasters meeting because she saw that it can help her career at work. She envisioned herself being in front of the room and leading the next business meeting. However, from the moment she joined and had that vision, no plan was put into place to help her get there. Instead of playing it safe and waiting for the best opportune time, she would have been better served by developing a targeted plan of action on what she wanted to accomplish. Working that plan and re-evaluating often to change with her career and lifestyle so it stays fresh and achievable gives her a reason to stay.

Whether you are a new member or have been a member for years, I challenge you to look back at why you joined Toastmasters and evaluate if it is being met on a consistent basis. If you had a different idea at the beginning and find you have been sitting on the sidelines 'playing it safe', the best advice I can give you is to forget waiting for the best conditions and just get up and speak. It gets easier the more you do it. ▲

The District Leadership Committee Report and the bio form for each candidate is posted on the D8 website.

* Per election procedures, nominations for all positions will be accepted from the floor. As per the directive from Toastmasters International, all Elected Leader positions must be held by a member in good standing of a Toastmasters club in good standing, meet the qualifications for office and are committed to the responsibilities of the respective role. Floor candidates must be nominated by a member of the district council or their proxyholder. Floor candidates may self-nominate when they are a member of the district council or a proxyholder. All nominees must complete the Officer Acceptance and Release form, submit to the District Director, and meet the qualifications for the office. Note: Article VII of the District Administrative Bylaws states that division directors shall have served at least six consecutive months as members of district council. District councils are comprised of club presidents and club vice president education. ▲

At the district council business meeting, each club president and vice president education in attendance is entitled to one vote. However, if either or both officers cannot attend, they may designate, in writing, any other active member of their club to act as proxy or proxies for their club. (Use form below.) No other proxies are valid at this meeting – per Article X, Paragraph (d) of the District Administrative Bylaws.

In the event one of these officers does not attend the meeting and has not designated, in writing, an active member of the club to act as his or her proxy, the officer or proxy holder in attendance is deemed to hold the proxy of the other, and may therefore cast two votes at the meeting. This assures that every club is represented by two votes.

In addition, each district officer, including Area Directors, in attendance is entitled to one vote. Only district executive committee members carrying either credential or proxy certificates from their club are allowed three votes. All other members are limited to a maximum of two votes each.

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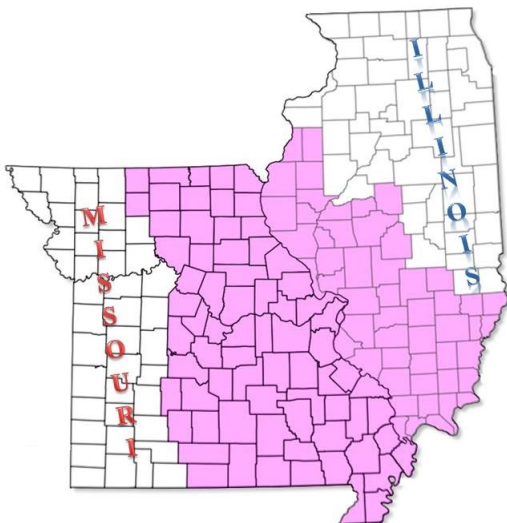
