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Half Way to Distinguished!

Fellow Toastmasters, can you believe that our Toastmasters year is half over? We're making good progress toward our goals. Thanks to the open houses and other membership drives, we have recruited even more new members this Toastmasters year than this time last year. Why is this so significant?

Increased member recruitment means that our Clubs are growing! And a growing Club is a healthy, vibrant Club that serves the needs of the most important person in this organization—YOU, the member. A Club that assists its members in meeting their personal goals will be Distinguished. The District goal is 60 Distinguished Clubs.

In order to be Distinguished, by June 30, 2010 a Club must have 20 paid members or a net growth of 5 members compared to its July 1, 2009 membership base. Also, a Club must meet at least 5 of the 10 Distinguished Club Program (DCP) goals. Completion of 7 goals will enable a

Club to be Select Distinguished, and 9 goals will enable it to achieve the highest honor that any Club can achieve . . . President's Distinguished. As of the time that this article is being written, 38 of our 99 chartered Clubs already have achieved at least 3 DCP goals!

What steps is your Club taking to ensure that it will be Distinguished, Select Distinguished, . . . or even President's Distinguished? Are you regularly reviewing and updating the Club Success Plan that was prepared last summer? What if your Club has not yet completed the Club Success Plan and invited every Club member to vote on its approval? If those measures have not already been completed, it is not too late, but PLEASE complete this task immediately.

While we are ensuring that our existing Clubs are Distinguished, we also have a responsibility to share the lifechanging benefits that this organization offers by chartering new Clubs. Ask yourself where would you be if not for Toastmasters? How has it changed YOUR life? Do you want to offer those same opportunities to others? Several prospective Clubs are close to chartering, and we always are looking for other possibilities. If your business,

The Education and Training Corner

Fellow District 8 Toastmasters, we are now at the half way point in the Toastmasters' year and the district's education award levels are doing well. From a district standpoint we have attained 62% of our Competent Communicator's goal. This means as a district we are on pace to attain one of the critical success factors to become a distinguished district. While this is great news for our district, it is also in your club's best interest to have every member working on a CC. Club members earning CC's is among goals in the Distinguished Club Program (DCP) and shows



your club is helping develop members' skills. It also demonstrates that your club is recruiting, retaining and mentoring each member toward their goals.

I recently attended a 'networking' function in which the keynote speaker provided great insight into positive thinking. I walked away with the take away message to keep a positive attitude in my outlook and my thinking. Part of the thought process is referred to as the "Three C's" which were:

- 1. Commitment: Staying power;
- 2. Challenge: To learn and grow;
- 3. Control: Being in control of one's Destiny helps through effort to create

This fits in perfectly with the District 8 theme of the year. (Remember you *Cre-8 Your Own Destiny...)* The Competent Communicator award fits this mold perfectly. Consider the following: You must "commit" to getting your speeches completed and to your growth. You have the "challenge" of presenting each speech at your club as you proceed where you learn, get feedback and grow. Finally, you are in "control" of your progress. You set your pace and you determine your success. As you can see, it is not a stretch to see this model applies to the Competent Communicator effort. When all ten CC speech projects are complete you will achieve the high degree of accomplishment of one who completes goals and you will show personal leadership and individual growth. Completing your CC award recognizes that you have begun to "Cre-8 Your Own Destiny..."

Training at the Mid Year TLI

A strong club is normally represented by a strong executive team. How does a team of officers get strong? They become strong by constantly working to improve their knowledge through practice and learning. As club officers your training efforts are recognized as one of the points in your Distinguished Club Plan (DCP) success plan. I would like to strongly encourage every club in District 8 to send all seven officers to the Mid Year TLI training on January 30, 2010 or a scheduled Division make-up TLI session. Every officer can learn something new by attending and networking to pick up fresh ideas on administering your office. Club Coaching Experience at Script Masters

In July 2007, my home club Script Masters experienced a great challenge in our membership makeup when work on the new company headquarters was completed. A number of our members were moved to the new location. At the time of this move. Script Masters had 39 members, with more than half moving. This had a great impact on the club meetings. By the time Toastmasters renewal came around in October 2007, we had 5 members, with only 2 able to attend meetings. The headquarters move affected our club membership greatly.

Determined not to let our club collapse, in November 2007, Script Masters conducted a kick off meeting to introduce Toastmasters International to guests at the new Headquarters location. We had around 27 guests attend and it was a huge success. Many guests joined right away. By the time December came, we had 11 new members just below the club coach cutoff. I asked my Area Governor, John Barry for assistance.

Our assigned club coaches: Bob Blattman and Bernie Donnelly began attending our club meetings. These two were an asset far beyond what I had hoped for. They gave speeches for our new members who were not ready to speak and they filled various roles sometimes performing multiple roles.

Bob taught us the importance of the Competent Leader Manual. Club members began bringing their manuals to meetings and using them. Both Bob and Bernie encouraged and sometimes nudged members to give speeches. It was as if whatever they had to say, our members responded. Bob and Bernie kept us organized and allowed us to keep moving forward by answering questions. They offered useful advice. They were invaluable, not

only to my club, but to me personally. You see, I was still working at the original location and had to travel back and forth to attend meetings. I wasn't always able to be there to offer our new club members the support and guidance they needed. Bob and Bernie were there to do that job for me. This allowed me to concentrate on our club at the other location. We began holding meetings again and other Toastmasters around the District came to our aid in this time of need.

Could we have rebuilt our club without the assistance of a Club Coach? The only answer I have is, with the amount of work and dedication it takes to rebuild a club from the ground up, I am so thankful I don't know that answer. My question is why would I want to? We have experienced and dedicated Toastmasters around District 8 waiting to offer their help-all you have to do is ask. I requested help and now Script Masters has 24 members. The club is doing great. Thanks so much to members of District 8 who are willing to be there when we need them. •
