To become more accustomed to video, I plan to produce short 2-3 minute videos for posting on the District 8 website about every 2-3 weeks. My goal is to complete the Advanced Manual: Communicating on Video. This manual has five projects:

- Instructing on the Internet Watch for training program that identifies a specific problem and then solves it!

What manual will you be completing on your next leg of your Toastmaster journey? And what is your estimated time of arrival? Come fly with me! •










Hello, District 8 Toastmasters!
































The Best Thing I Ever Did for Myself

ind your voice. What exactly does that mean? To fellow Toastmaster, Kat Mokriakow, it means having a voice and knowing how to use it. Before Toastmasters, Kat described herself as "beyond shy." She knew she wanted to do something more than what she was doing. When she applied for a supervisor position, she was told she was not good enough to be a supervisor. After hearing that, Kat joined Toastmasters but was afraid to speak at meetings. She realized she needed Toastmasters, and she realized that Toastmasters was more than speaking.

At her first District 8 Conference, Kat had a ticket to the Table Topics session which was given to her by someone unable to attend. Kat didn't know anyone there. She met John Mohr who introduced himself as; I'm John Mohr - just like the lawn mower". Kat will never forget that John befriended her and stayed with her the entire Friday evening.

When Kat questioned if she could become a club officer, Dawn Tucker encouraged her to take an officer role. Kat became a club president because Dawn told her she could. Kat decided it was time to interact more and step up into additional leadership roles. She took the Area Governor visits seriously. At her visits, the club presidents chose what they wanted Kat to speak about. She took it back to basics never assuming they knew. While Division Governor, Kat saw herself as leading a team. She encouraged Area Governors in her division by sharing her experiences as Area Governor. Kat learned two important lessons as District 8 Secretary: note-taking is challenging for accurate reporting and acute listening skills are required.

The PRO was a role Kat loved! She described it as busy, rewarding and fun. She enjoyed the fellowship and camaraderie. As PRO, she learned a higher level of leadership. Kat performed tasks she had never done. With the Working Women's Survival Show, she was a writer, director, project director and promoter. The visual reports of all PRO activities were appreciated and showed them how to be involved and informed. Kat embraced the Storytelling event but found organizing it

frustrating. However, on the scheduled day, there were Toastmasters who came through for her. They were standing at



the door waiting for her asking how can I help and what can I do. When this event is held again, Kat wants to be a part of it. She wants to improve it using the suggestions she received.

When asked how Toastmasters has been instrumental in her promotions at Express Scripts, Kat shared the following with me. In January, 2012, she applied for Quality Auditor. A fellow Toastmaster advised Kat not to talk about Toastmasters during the interview, but the interviewer wanted to hear all about her Toastmasters' experiences. Kat was promoted to Quality Auditor. In September, 2012, Kat was promoted to Supervisor. For this position, Kat was asked about her years of experience in leadership. When experience in leadership pertained to her jobs, it was a paragraph. When it pertained to Toastmasters, it was a page. It was Kat's Toastmaster leadership experience that sealed the deal.

"The best thing I ever did for myself was join Toastmasters", says Kat. The best advice Tim Spezia gave her was to see things in other people and make "it" work – "it" being whatever needed to be done. It is people like Dawn Tucker, Tim Spezia and John Mohr who helped Kat use her voice.


