We are proud to claim 3 DTMs in our membership and several members that are actively pursuing their DTM. We are







As I enter the room, familiar faces loom amongst people I have never met before. I walk up and say hello to a fellow friend I haven't seen in a while, and then take a moment to introduce myself to the stranger sitting in the next row. I know by the time I leave this place, that stranger will be my friend the next time we meet. I take my seat as the contest begins. One by one the contestants speak, giving their best, moving to the tempo of their stories, and leaving impressions on their listeners. I note a certain word I can use for my club's next Word of the Day, catch a turn of a phrase that I can add to my style of speaking, and feel the excitement they are able to impart upon me in the spirit of competition. At the end of the contests, the interviews begin and I get to know each contestant on a personal basis. I

hear what club they are competing for and how they made the decision to compete in the first place. I am always surprised and delighted to hear when a competitor says they have only been a Toastmaster for less than six months.

Wow! What an inspiration these contestants are to me and everyone in the room. During the moments of the interviews, I hear their stories and I say to myself, 'yes I and all the others who are hesitant out there can do that too'. These people are normal Toastmasters from normal clubs taking chances, putting themselves forward so they are not holding themselves back, and growing personally in the process. As a very wise Toastmaster once told me, "it is not about winning that makes it important to compete, it is about doing it". It is a hurdle, a fear that keeps up from stepping up to the plate and taking the hit. You never know when you might see me walk across the 'stage' at an area contest, throwing my hat into the ring-just to do it.



Whether I am helping out at a contest or just there to be a cheerleader, I walk away feeling great. The joy I receive in having fun: LAUGH. The creativity in speaking I get from the competitors: LEARN. Then the camaraderie I feel in being with Toastmasters from other divisions: CONNECT. All this fuels me to look deeper, strive harder, and continue to go on.

District 8 Credential/Proxy Certificate

At the district council business meeting, each club president and vice president education in attendance is entitled to one vote. However, if either or both officers cannot attend, they may designate, in writing, any other active member of their club to act as proxy or proxies for their club. (Use form below.) No other proxies are valid at this meeting – per Article X, Paragraph (d) of the District Administrative Bylaws.

In the event one of these officers does not attend the meeting and has not designated, in writing, an active member of the club to act as his or her proxy, the officer or proxy holder in attendance is deemed to hold the proxy of the other, and may therefore cast two votes at the meeting. This assures that every club is represented by two votes.

In addition, each district officer, including Area Directors, in attendance is entitled to one vote. Only district executive committee members carrying either credential or proxy certificates from their club are allowed three votes. All other members are limited to a maximum of two votes each.

Member Focus: Brian Jones

Brian Jones joined the Shelter Insurance Toastmasters Club (#7349) barely a year ago, and is a shining example of the benefits Toastmasters has to offer.

Jones was employed by Shelter Insurance as a corporate recruiter in April of 2012. He moved to the training department of the home office and realized his new position would have him speaking frequently. He joined the corporate club at work and began advancing along both Speaker and Leader tracks. He served a term as club Vice President – Membership and within a year had achieved both his Competent Communicator and Competent Leader awards.

A fellow club member, Patricia Tabor, shared that Jones has a knack for speaking to everyone in the audience, no matter what their particular background. In a recent speech about the Black Lives Matter movement, Jones explained both sides and shared personal anecdotes. He left her – and everyone in the room – with the idea that not only is there at least two sides to every story but that there is hope that we can all grow together. She said, "Brian shared enough of himself so that each person could relate to his speech in a different way."

Jones' family is the most important thing to him, and in several of his talks he has shared personal stories about his wife, two daughters, and extended family.

Recently, Jones was tapped by Shelter Insurance to serve as the first Manager of Diversity and Inclusion at the company. He couldn't be more pleased.

Asked about the impact Toastmasters has had on his life and career, he said, "Since I've moved to Columbia both of my roles have required lots of public speaking. Being a Toastmaster has given me multiple opportunities to improve and given me more confidence when I'm standing in front of a group."
