The Distinguished Toastmaster award is the highest recognition a member may receive from Toastmasters International. The DTM recognizes a superior level of achievement in both communication and leadership. District 8's tradition includes the DTM Lineup after the presenter and recipient speeches and presentation of an engraved DTM medallion.

For the Communication Track, CC, ACB, ACS, and ACG, the members listed below completed 40 speeches (10 from the Competent Communication manual and 30 from the Advanced Communication Series), conducted any two presentations from The Better Speaker Series and/or The Successful Club Series, conducted a presentation from the Success/Leadership Series, Success/Communication Series, or Youth Leadership and coached a new member with the first three speech projects.

For the Leadership Track, CL, ALB, and ALS, these members completed the *Competent Leadership* manual, served at least six months as a club officer (president, vice president education, vice president membership, vice president public relations, secretary, treasurer, sergeant at arms) and participated in the preparation of a Club Success Plan and in a district-sponsored club officer training while serving in office, conducted any two presentations from *The Successful Club Series* and/or *The Leadership Excellence Series*, served a complete term as a district officer (district director, program quality director, club growth director, public relations manager, logistics manager, finance manager, division director or area director), completed a *High Performance Leadership* program and served successfully as a club sponsor, mentor or coach.



The Toastmasters Leadership Institute (TLI) where our club officers are trained is setting up to be the event of the year! With Dhanuja Singh (District 8 International Contest Champion 2016) leading this year, there are lot of new ideas that will result in officers being more than ready to lead their clubs this next Toastmasters year. The first new feature you will find is the officer training is scheduled for two hours in length. The training consists of what you need to know to be a club officer, transferrable skills, and building the club success plan. When you walk out of the training, you will have something concrete to take back to your club. I call it a 'bird in the hand'.



For many of the club officers the club success plan will be unfamiliar to you and you will be sharing in a discovery of a new way to be involved as a club leader. Dos and Don'ts of Promoting Toastmasters

District 8 is leading the way to promoting Toastmasters membership to the public. We are chartering new clubs both in the community and in the corporate environment. We have initiated Division Conferences to make rich educational opportunities within geographical and financial reach of more members. We have a district website, www.dist8tm.org, and a FaceBook page that is located on the home page of the website. Several clubs, areas, and divisions also have social media accounts, the most popular being FaceBook. While everyone is encouraged to promote Toastmasters, it is important to follow a few rules. As District 8's Public Relations Manager, I offer the following guidance.

DO: Refer to the 72 page <u>Brand Manual</u> on the Toastmasters International website which provides professionally designed templates for websites, business cards, website banners, club banners, and many more topics. Use of these templates is not optional. We all need to protect the Toastmasters brand.

DON'T: Forget that you can contact the District Public Relations manager at prm@dist8TM.org with any questions.

DO: Submit press releases about your club's activities and members' accomplishments to your local newspapers and TV stations. When submitting, use the Toastmasters official press release template located on the Toastmasters International website in the Resource Library. You will need to login. In the search boxes, choose Public Relations as the topic and type the word "release" as a keyword to find them all. We will put a link on the District 8 website too. There are templates for open houses, anniversary celebrations, and communication achievements. Press releases can result in free publicity via an article by a reporter or a radio or TV appearance.

DON'T: Alter or delete the "About Toastmasters International" text at the bottom of the template.

DO: Take lots of pictures and videos of your activities.

DON'T: Post pictures of anyone on any Toastmasters page or in a printed or digital publication without their express permission. There is an exception. At large events, you may publicize that photos and video will be taken and permission is assumed unless individuals opt out either at registration or upon arrival. This must also be announced at the beginning of the event. It is a best practice to place it on a registration form. The Photo Release Form and Video Release Form releases are located in the Club Officers section of District 8's website.

DO: LIKE the District 8 FaceBook page and LIKE, COMMENT, and SHARE items posted. Our goal is to post at least 2 items a day. The more you interact with our page, the more FaceBook algorithms "decide" to show our page to non-Toastmasters which increases the potential that your club could gain new members. Sharing our posts on your personal page will also let your friends begin to see you as a source of information about public speaking.

Proposal A Online Dues Payment to TI Versus Cub Dues Collection and Member Good Standing

Following is one of several proposed amendments to the Bylaws of Toastmasters International (TI) and Club Constitution for Clubs of Toastmasters International that will be voted on during the Annual Business Meeting on August 26, 2017, in Vancouver, British Columbia. Your club will have the opportunity to cast its vote on these important issues in person or by proxy.

Proposal A

This proposal would allow members to individually pay their dues online (new or renewing). A club officer would subsequently need to verify the individual. If this is approved, a system will be developed. This would result in an improved user experience, more accurate member data and reduced credit card security risks.

In response to an inquiry by one of the District 8 Area Directors regarding a potential situation under this proposal where a member pays their dues to TI but fail to pay club dues, TI provided clarification. As the new payment process is being developed, a process will also be implemented to instruct and enable club officers to verify that each individual is a member of their club. One option could be that an email is sent to the club officers indicating that a member wants to pay dues to the club. Assuming that the person has already been admitted to membership in the club, the officer could follow a link and quickly and easily verify the member's payment which would then be processed.

Regarding an individual's "good standing" with a club, the officer, just as now, would only finalize a member's payment to Toastmasters International when all club-imposed measures have been finalized.

The Board is presenting this proposal to the membership in August this year to enable World Headquarters to develop the process and modify the current system to support online dues payments directly to Toastmasters International for those individuals and clubs who choose to do so. Currently, TI envisions payment of only the Toastmasters International dues, not the club dues that some clubs charge to members. TI anticipates that these changes would be implemented no earlier than the fourth quarter of 2018.

Members would still need to pay club dues directly to the club in a manner designated by the club. Members would be able to pay Toastmasters International dues the same way they do now, or they would be able to pay them by credit card via toastmasters.org. This process will reduce or eliminate credit card information security concerns and risks that exist today. In addition, TI anticipates that this process will improve the overall member experience by enabling them to quickly and easily pay dues. \mathfrak{J}
