Message from your District Program Quality Director

Happy New Year District 8 Toastmasters!

It has been a wonderful program year thus far. The Pathways rollout has presented some challenges, but some of the apprehension has been mitigated, thanks to the hard work of RJ Stratton presenting "Pathways Made Simple" sessions around the district and during the District 8 Leadership Expo and Toastmasters Leadership Institute (TLI).

The presentations received a lot of positive feedback and was instrumental in getting more members to adopt Pathways. Speaking of adopting Pathways, here are some statistics for District 8.

As of November 1, 2018; 55.62% of members are enrolled in Pathways, 71.12% of club officers are enrolled, and 49.43% of new members are enrolled. District 8 is a part of Region 5, which consists of 10 districts.

The Region 5 Pathways adoption rates are as follows; 56.05% of members are enrolled, 69.12% of club officers are enrolled, and 52.40% of new members are enrolled. Let's aim for a goal of a 75% adoption rate for all categories.

Achieving educational awards is one of the greatest milestones in your Toastmasters journey. As of December 31, 2018; 281 educational awards have been earned in District 8 with 116 of those earned in the Pathways program! Great job team! What a fantastic accomplish-



ment. Nineteen members have gone the extra mile and achieved at least three educational awards, which will earn them the Triple Crown Award. So, who is next? I know we can get 50 Triple Crown winners.

A quality club experience is paramount in order to attract and retain members. The Distinguished Club Program (DCP) is one of the best ways to measure club quality. The DCP is an annual Toastmasters program that begins on July 1st and ends on June 30th. Clubs that achieve distinguished status, normally are healthy clubs which will foster an environment conducive for personal growth.

To qualify for distinguished status, clubs must achieve at least 5 out of 10 DCP goals, along with 20 paid members or a net growth of 5 members from the July 1st base membership. As of December 30, 2018, thirteen clubs are almost distinguished, which means they have achieved at least 4 DCP goals or

need more members. Please go to www.toastmasters.org and review the dashboard to see what your club needs. If you have any questions, please contact your Division or Area Directors for assistance. I want to give a shout out to South County, Mastertoasters, and Horace Mann for achieving at least 8 DCP goals.

The District 8 Leadership Expo and the Winter TLI were very successful and provided some momentum for District 8. A big thank you for all those who made it possible. Events of these magnitude are not easy to organize.

We are gearing up for a big run toward the end of the Toastmasters Program Year. We are finishing up club officer make-up training and contest season is upon us.

There are two big events left in the program year. On May 3rd & 4th the annual Spring Conference will be held at the Holiday Inn – Airport West in Earth City, MO and on June 22nd, the Summer TLI will be held at the Maritz Corporation located in Fenton, MO.

We will need volunteers to assist with organizing the events. If you need credit for a high-performance leadership project or just want to help, then this your chance.

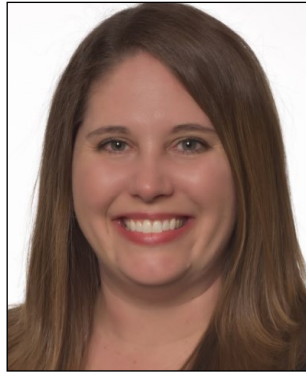
Message from your District Club Growth Director

Each Division will arrange for make-up sessions. In addition to receiving valuable information about your role as an officer, TI will give each club that has a minimum of four officers trained in the summer and winter sessions a DCP (Distinguished Club Program) point. The training for the winter sessions must be done **no later than February 28, 2019**. Don't pass up the personal development training set aside just for you.

Looking back over 2018, there were a lot of new things and changes that took place and there is more growth planned in 2019. The PRM Theme for this Toastmaster year was Creating New Paths of Culture, Synergy & Communications throughout District 8. I believe we are doing that...starting with:

The New Educational Program 'Pathways' which was rolled out in District 8, February of 2018, replacing the old traditional program. There was a lot of resistance to the new program, as there always is with change. Although some District 8 members are still struggling with Pathways, huge steps were made to help with the understanding of Pathways and transitioning from old to a new educational program.

I first introduced the "Pathways Made Simple" presentation, at the District Leadership Expo and it proved to be instrumental in helping members 18-80, relate to and understand the Pathways Program. It has since been presented throughout the district, at key locations and various areas.

There is even a video now of the Pathways Made Simple presentation available to watch on the District 8 YouTube Channel. In addition, numerous Pathways helpful tools and documents were created for the benefit of the district members, Pathways Overview (detailed breakdown of all the levels & pro-

jects), DTM Requirements Document, even a new Pathways Goal Setting & Progress Tracking Form, can all be found on the District 8 website under Member Resources.

Members are well on track now to finishing the first of many Paths in the new educational program and making the transition to Pathways.

A Communication Committee was formed and a communications plan was developed for improving District 8 communications, both internally and externally. The PRM Committee is made up of district members from different geographical locations, from the most remote areas to the concentrated urban areas; from a balance of Division & Area representation, so that all members would be represented, kept in the loop and have a voice in the district.

In the words of our District 8 Director, Elaine Curry, DTM "WE ARE A VILLAGE." Social Media was put to more use with improving the

communications to District 8 members and the general public... Facebook, Meetup, YouTube, and Linked In were woven into the communication plan to meet the needs to inform & promote district 8 toastmasters to the general public and to keep members informed and create internal dialog in a closed group setting.

Social media is also being used to find new members and to assist in membership retention, such as Meetup being used by clubs, to add new members to their club and the District 8 YouTube to create DIY training videos and testimonials.

To raise awareness and promote toastmasters and District 8, so far this toastmasters year there have been two highly successful, Public Relations Events, The St. Louis, Missouri Athletic Club, Leaders Speakers Expo, held at the MAC down town St. Louis and the St. Louis Small Biz Expo, St. Charles Convention Center.

Both events generated a lot of interested in toastmasters and resulted in new members being added to clubs throughout entire district, Eastern Missouri & Southern Illinois. More public events and district activities are planned for 2019.

I am looking forward to taking this VILLAGE to higher levels of culture, synergy & communications in 2019.

When I was the Club Growth Director, I received a phone call from one of our members who lives in one of the areas that are farther out from St Louis. She shared how her club struggles to get members to step up and serve as a club officer, yet the Rotary club across town is thriving and people are competing to be leaders of the club.

Since that call, I have pondered why this is happening. Why do we have to beg our members to serve our clubs and district when other non-profit clubs do not share this issue to the extent we do. Division Director

To qualify:

- Served on a district council (club president or VPE) for at least six consecutive months

Club Growth Director

You are responsible for all aspects of marketing, club building, and club-retention efforts within the district. This includes defining an overall marketing strategy for the district, developing outreach and retention efforts with existing community and corporate clubs and penetrating new markets. Additionally, the CGD support challenged clubs and helps them to become distinguished.

To qualify:

- Served as a club president for at least six consecutive months
- Served as a division director or area director for at least one consecutive year

Spring Speech Contests are Coming!

Are You Ready?



The speech contest season is upon us. The contest season in the district will run from Jan – May. There will be two contests: Evaluation Contest and International Contest.

Eligibility requirements for any official contest;

- Members must be a paid member of the club, area, division, and district in which he or she is competing.
- Club must be in good standing.
- New, dual, or reinstated member must have dues and membership application current with World Headquarters.

In addition, to be eligible to compete in the International Speech Contest,

- Member must have completed six speech projects in the Competent Communication manual or a minimum of two levels in the Toastmasters Pathways learning experience.

Please refer to Speech Contest

Rulebook dated July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019 for eligibility details. You can find the rulebook on the district website (dist8tm.org)

We highly encourage all clubs to hold a speech contest versus just sending contestants to the area level. This puts contestants at a disadvantage if they have not had the chance to compete at all levels and gain the experience necessary to be ready to compete in the Semi-Finals. Even if the club is small, partner with other clubs for help. Being small is no reason to forgo a contest.

Ask Division Director and Area Director for guidance if needed. Club contests are a great way to break the monotony of a regular club meeting and to promote your club.

1, **Club** contests are normally held from Jan – Feb.

2, **Area** Contests are normally held

in March.

3. **Division** Contests normally held in April.

Volunteers will be needed at all levels of the contests, so please lend a helping hand.

The District Contest will be held on May 3rd & 4th at the Annual Spring Conference. Details for the Conference location are published on the district 8 website. (dist8tm.org)

For the first time, the District 8 International Speech Contest will be video recorded, so it can be sent to the Regional Semi-Finals for judging.

Those who win the semi-finals will advance to the World Championship of Public Speaking held August 21-24, 2019 in Denver, CO, new home of Toastmasters International.

The event was attended by well over 180 district members. The day started with a powerful and amazing Keynote speech by author, speaker, trainer, and Certified John Maxwell Coach, Kim Burke. It was followed by club officer training and elective sessions, conducted by some of the most outstanding speakers and trainers in District 8.
