<u>District 8 Proxy Certificate</u> <u>District Council Meeting</u>

For Presidents and Vice Presidents Education

At the district council business meeting, each club president and vice president education in attendance is entitled to one vote. However, if both officers cannot attend, they may designate, in writing, any other active member of their club to act as proxy for their club. (use form below). No other proxy is valid at this meeting - per Article X, Paragraph (d) of the District Administrative Bylaws.

In the event one of these officers does not attend the meeting and has not designated, in writing, an active member of the club to act as his or her proxy, the officer or proxy holder in attendance is deemed to hold the proxy of the other, and may therefore cast two votes at the meeting. This assures that every club is represented by two votes. Proxy holders or club presidents/VPEs are limited to a maximum of two votes each.

In addition, each district officer, including Area Directors, in attendance is entitled to one vote. Only district executive committee members carrying either credential or proxy certificates from their club are allowed three votes. All other members are limited to a maximum of two votes each.



I want to give a shout out to Alpha Toastmasters and Central West End Toastmasters for winning the 7-4-7 Award by getting all seven club officers trained during the first and second round of club officer training. Each club will receive a \$80.00 gift certificate to the District 8 Bookstore.

As you know, we are deep in contest season. The Area Contests are winding down and the Division Contests will soon begin. Please go out and support your fellow Toast-masters that are participating as contestants. The competition is fierce, and you never know, the next World Champion of Public Speaking may come from District 8.

Also, the Area and Division Directors need your support to run the contests. It is a stressful time for them as they plan their contests. They need functionaries such as Ballot Counters, Timers, Contest Chair, etc. It is a great chance for personal growth and possible credit for a High-Performance Leadership Project.

keep moving and go for a 75% adoption rate across the board.

I want to send a hearty congratulations to St. Francis Toastmasters, LCMS Toastmasters, Toast of Belleville, UniGroup Toastmasters, WelDon Toastmasters, Collinsville Toastmasters, and Smedley Hometown Memorial Toastmasters for having over a 90% adoption rate of all members enrolled in Pathways. Outstanding! Job well done!

On May 3rd & 4th, we are having our Annual District 8 Spring Conference. The theme is "Charting the Path". It is going to be a fun-filled event featuring the Evaluation and International Speech Competitions.

For the first time ever, the International Speech Contest will be video recorded, and the winning speech will be sent to a panel of judges to determine the Regional Champion.

The Regional Champion will move on to compete in August at the Semi-Finals in Denver, Colorado to vie for the coveted world title.

The Spring Conference will also have educational sessions, a funnight activity, recognition ceremonies.
