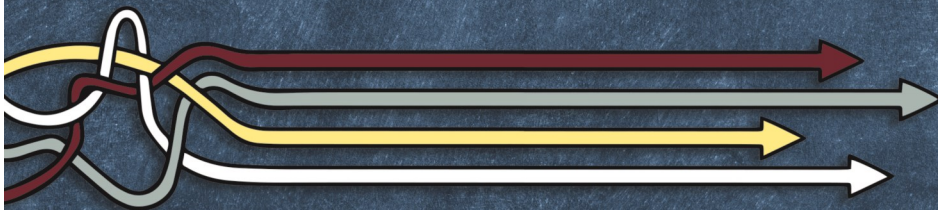

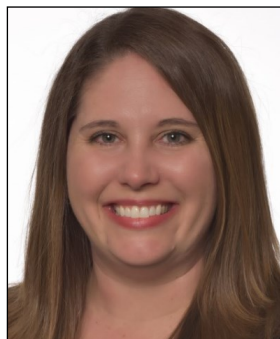

All Toastmasters Need to Capture Some 'Goalrillas'

Toastmasters need to look for 'GOALRILLAS' and interact with them everyday. Toastmasters will not have to go on safari or take a trip to the local zoo to venture into their winning and wonderful world. 'GOALRILLAS' is a powerful term to represent your personal improvement goals in the areas of communication and leadership as an active member of Toastmasters International. Goals are actions/behaviors intentionally identified and executed according to a specified timeline.

Recognize some of the 'GOALRILLAS' in your Toastmaster experience as the earning of educational awards thru Pathways or the 2020 retiring traditional educational program; being a contestant in a speech contest; and/or holding a club/district officer position. You need to intentionally and periodically hunt for your next 'GOALRILLAS' based on your acquaintance with prior "GOALRILLAS" and your Toastmasters progress. Keep the following in mind as you approach all 'GOALRILLAS':

First, 'GOALRILLAS' are compelling. They will confront you with vim and vigor. You are the master of this hunt and so you should not be surprised when they assault your senses. Your style of communication and leadership will definitely change under their persuasive and pervasive influence. You shouldn't be afraid of them. Rather you should welcome their help in focusing your time, talents, and treasure to your personal best Toastmasters benefit.

Secondly, 'GOALRILLAS' are rarely cozy and comfortable to interact with face to face. Realize their necessary place in your Toastmasters membership. This will help with the periodic confrontation and choices that you will have to make in this organizational relationship. Your 'GOALRILLAS' are inescapable and long lasting in their influence on you. Learn to co-exist with them as ideal partners in gaining Toastmasters expertise as a speaker and as a leader.

Thirdly, 'GOALRILLAS' are great confidence and competence builders. They do the heavy sifting of all the things in your Toastmaster journey and leave you with a strong set of abilities and capabilities. 'GOALRILLAS' help you climb to heights of personal best that are both desirable and useful. Never enter a Toastmasters club meeting, conference, or contest without your ever evolving troop of 'GOALRILLAS' top of mind.

It is no surprise that 'GOALRILLAS' in your Toastmasters world travel logically and easily into the habitat of the rest of your life. Welcome and celebrate their co-existence with you wherever you find yourself in this world.

Brad then pulled off each negative label in turn and explained how these labels can be thrown away instead of holding us back.

Keynote Speaker Sam Silverstein

Sam Silverstein, our keynote speaker's mission is to empower people to live accountable lives, transform the way they do business, and to thrive at extraordinary levels.

Sam emphasized accountability by sharing a personal versus professional conflict. Sam once failed to merge his personal and professional calendars. The result was his professional commitment required him to be in Washington DC the morning after his daughter's high school graduation. His accountable solution was to lease an airplane and pilot to whisk him from St. Louis after the graduation to Washington. His commitment to accountability put a major dent in speaking fee! Sam's advice. When facing a challenge, decide to whom you are accountable.

Sam asked us to decide who we are accountable for? Obvious answers include wife, children, and perhaps other relatives. The question can be clarified by considering if we are responsible for

Accountability comes from a commitment to people. Sam urges us to build accountable relationships and live up to our values.

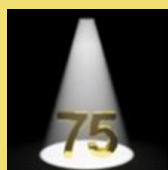
