Financial Updates: RJ Stratton on behalf of Brianna Snow

- Membership revenue is higher than budgeted we are growing despite budget and membership concerns!
- Expenses: Not a lot going on
 - P&L numbers look good
 - District store, travel, club growth etc. less than usual
 - TLI would have been a larger expense if it wasn't on Zoom
- Admin expenses are generally monthly
 - New storage space for district assets and historical documents better pricing
- Education and trainings have a negative balance as accruals from last year have been carried over
- If you have a voucher that hasn't been redeemed, you can still submit it to the district trio or the bookstore manager Tim
- We are overall operating slightly over budget.

- Newsletter is delayed, but we are working on publishing it next quarter
- Meetup has been a very successful way to recruit new members

- 5 clubs which have 100% Pathways enrollment
 - $\circ~~$ 7 clubs with 75% and above
 - 6 clubs 25-75%
- 74 educational achievements since July 1, but no triple crowns as of now
- 218 renewed members for October-March
- As of January 5, 52 new members
- No club leads at the moment
- 3 clubs that are experiencing challenges
- Special Events:
 - 7 clubs are hosting Club Contests
 - Area 4 successfully held a joint Area club meeting.

- All areas have 80% or more Pathways adoption overall
- 57 overall awards in Division B, 15 since last DEC meeting
- 3 L5s completed
- 3 clubs with at least 5 goals
 - Ascension Health

 - Noon Time and Crossroads (7 goals)
- 1 club under 8 members (7 members)
- 9 additional clubs under 12 members

- Second member in that club
- Speech contests underway Capital City and Montgomery county finished and Gem City on 1/20/21
- Area 1 McBrian Lincoln Douglas will celebrate 85 years on March 1. They were chartered in 1936 and their club number is 51
- Combined area contests between Area 1 and 10 and Area 6 and 11
- Pre-LI was held for make up training
 - Each area had officers that were able to attend
- 2 clubs that have met 6 goals for DTC
 - Gem City and League of Our Own
- Membership is still a challenge
 - No changes from November
 - A couple clubs on cusp, working to hit numbers by April
- Celebrations
 - Scott Airforce Base Club has consistently added members since Open House
 - Fairview Heights Facebook as a tool to connect on other platforms led to increased members
 - Linda Mlot presented Toastmasters to Rotary Club and was able to have them attend
 - Potential to host Speechcraft in future

Division E: Curtis Scroggins

- 6 clubs with 21+ members
 - Techmasters has 41
- 3 clubs that qualify for a coach
- 7 clubs with 0 goals met on DCP
- Area and Division contests are scheduled
- Strengths
 - Club visits were completed for all but 1 club in the Division.
 - 6 Clubs have membership of 21 or above with Techmasters showing 41 members to date
 - Area 20 St. Charles and Techmasters have met 5 goals, and Mastertoasters and Cave Springs clubs have met 4 goals
- Weaknesses
 - 3 Clubs qualify for Club Coach
 - 4 Clubs has 0 members
 - 7 Clubs have 0 goals met on the DSP
- Opportunities

- Recurring Speaker Series want to use as a way to introduce toastmasters by presenting speeches on educational topic areas
- Considering the creation of club consultants to provide targeted support for clubs

 - We want to maintain and expand the number of prison clubs in District 8

New Member Orientation: Shannon Geier Before They Ever Sign Their Name

- What is a member?
 - Each member is a limb of a club tree
- No guests at a meeting future toastmasters!
 - Helps new attendees feel like they are a part of the club
- Anyone can take a role what are easy ways future toastmasters get involved?
 Encourage and make a big deal about future toastmasters taking on roles!
- Make a good impression make meetings interesting
 - Introduce yourself and ask for a new fact about them increases bonding
- Keep attendees on mailing list increases visibility
 - Receive meeting invites, agenda, updates on club, and recaps from each meetings
- Celebrate accomplishments during meetings
 - New future toastmasters and members
 - Personal and professional accomplishments
 - Birthdays, anniversaries, etc.
- Check-in with toastmasters often
- Assist future toastmasters with paperwork
- Toastmasters "Swearing in" ceremony make it fun
- Keep track of future toastmasters on a spreadsheet, contact every once in a while to see if there is interest in joining

Resolving Conflict: RJ Stratton

- How to Succeed with People and Strengthen Your Team Paul McGee
 - Assess how different dynamics affect communications

- Improve team communication and strengthen relationships
- o Identify strategies that improve communication and relationships
- Ask the right questions and listen to understand
- Conflict
 - Conflict is what happens when two or more people have differences, real or perceived, that are not easily resolved
 - Conflict resolution is when you identify and address differences in a respectful way
- Types of Conflict
 - Contentious Personalities
 - Misunderstanding
 - Issues
 - Styles of Leadership
 - Perception
- Questions a Leader must ask when addressing conflict please share with other leaders in the district!
 - What is going on in their world at the moment?
 - What is new? What is different in their life that may be affecting them?
 - Are their priorities different, even temporarily?
 - What is important to them at this time?
 - Take the time to learn how is their time/money/effort being used?
 - Am I listening to understand or am I listening to defend?
 - People feel ignored when their cannot fully explain if you interrupt them and try to defend your opinion
 - Have I communicated my perspective clearly, and understood theirs?
- Leaders can't have a knee jerk reaction
 - Conflict can be resolved, and can lead to positive outcomes in the long-run
 - It has to be a two-way street
 - As a leader, it is up to you to take initiative and employ empathy
- RJ's suggestions
 - Don't leave an opportunity for conflict resolution
 - Let people speak and explain their feelings, so you can understand and reach a resolution

- Patrick Hunt is doing a great job as Area 4 Director! He was awarded the "Make a Difference Pin"
 - Encouraging cooperation with all of the different clubs in area
 - Hosted a successful Area Council Meeting with great attendance and participation

- Dawn Tucker: If Pathways says triple crown, then triple crown! Continue achieving!
- Andrew Welter: Mentoring project for triple crown can be very fulfilling you get to grow alongside another member.
- Nicole Arms: Want to walk with our club members to where they want to go.
 - We get new members and don't follow through. We need to have conversations so we know what they want to get out of it.
- Art Stanze: Ask future toastmasters what brought them to their first meeting ask them what they hope to get out of the experience, and see what the club can do for them.
- Elaine Curry: Mentoring is a relationship
 - If you can look at it that way as opposed to doing what they ask, then that relationship is a lot more meaningful.
 - Mentor relationships last past the projects you support people on.
- Remember that you can be a mentor without the title
