Greetings Member of The Great District 8!

I hope you are settling in as we end this first quarter of the Toastmaster year. Did you know that this year marks 100 years of Toastmaster existence? You know what else? Along with Toastmasters International, District 8 celebrates our anniversary in October. We have been here for 84 years of the 100 years! That is worth celebrating!

Great things are coming in this next century! One upcoming change is how we experience Base Camp. There will be a Base Camp outage beginning on October 9, 2024, that is expected to last through October 25, 2024. Be sure that all completed levels are approved in both Base Camp and Club Central and to avoid delaying your progress. Please note: the Speechcraft feature will not be available during this time. You can avoid delays in your progress by downloading pdfs of your full path during the outage. The new Base Camp will launch with six pathways but do not worry if you are enrolled in a different path before the outage, you will still have access. The new Base Camp will improve the Toastmasters education experience. If you have any issues downloading or accessing your path, check with your VPE or email pad@dist8tm.org.

Have you checked out the incentives that you and your club could earn simply by doing what you already do as a member? Submitting your membership renewal to your club treasurer or through Self-pay by **September 30, 2024**, automatically gets you three chances to get a Toastmaster Flip Top Water Bottle. Did you take the Plus One Pledge to bring a guest **before December 31**st? Well, if you show proof that you joined the pledge and your guest becomes a member, you will receive a gift card to a local retailer. For starting a new club this year, you become a Club Igniter, receive credit as a Club Sponsor, and receive \$100 to use at the Toastmaster Store. Your club can earn \$50 in refreshments or \$50 to use at the Toastmaster Shop by hosting an



Open House or Speechcraft that results in three (3) new members. (cont.)

Finally, as your club completes education levels, gains members and completes training, these things count towards the Fast Five to Distinguished incentive where you earn \$50 gift certificates to use in the Toastmaster Store. *Full description of the incentives can be found later in the newsletter.*

This is a special year for Toastmasters International as we close a century and begin a new century. We will be making a special store order specifically for the 100th Anniversary if you would like to take advantage of the bulk order. We will only be taking club orders so get your order into your Club representative. Clubs are asked to provide a flat rate \$5 towards the cost of shipping. Orders will be placed on October 26, 2024. You can submit your club order by clicking here.

Achieving Excellence - Program Quality

As we near the end of our first quarter, we are off to a great start. First, 97% of our clubs submitted their officer list before Jul 1st. This allows communication to flow from Toastmaster International and District 8 to the clubs. Having that information, club officers were made aware of the club officer training. We have had 80% of our clubs have 4 or more officers attend training. Area and Division Directors have also attended training. Already, there have been 107 Pathway levels completed, with 14 Toastmasters completing their path. (See the full listing of educational achievements in a separate section of Communic~8). Five clubs will be receiving the Club Values table-top banner for having all 7 officers attend training and submitting their goals for the year using the Club Success Plan. They are WUSTL Speaks, Speak Out Pfizer, Shalom Church Toastmasters, Jeffco Challengers, and Aetna Toastmasters. Congratulations to these clubs!!

Have you started to download or print off your next couple of projects? With the anticipation of the rollout of the new Learning Management System (LMS) we won't be able to access Pathways during the projected timeframe of Oct 9-25. Pathway Level completions will need to be approved before Oct 8th. Plan and download or print out projects you will be working on in October. If you have saved Pathway completion certificates, saved documents in "My Documents" or received feedback and want to reference them, they will also need to be downloaded before Oct 8th.

- To download projects, open up your pathway, go to Your Evaluation to download your projects


Base Camp Managers (VPE, President & Secretary)

If a level/path is marked complete in Base Camp but not submitted in Club Central, it won't be marked complete in the new base camp. We have planned several sessions to help you with preparing for the Pathway outage. Check the <u>D8 calendar</u> for those times to register.

Area contests are being scheduled in the month of February, Division level in March and the District contest will be held during the Annual Spring Conference in April. 
A Message From Our Club Growth Director Karen Dew

We currently have 390 members renewed, which mean we have quite a way to go to reach Distinguished status of 2,556. Please be mindful that the deadline is September 30th, 2024.

I have included the instructions on how to Renew and also the renewal incentives.


Log into your Toastmasters account at www.toastmasters.org
From the home page, scroll down until you see the header "From the Oranization to You". Within this header, click on "How to Renew"



Click on the "Renew membership" button. (This Club has enabled Self-Pay.)

• The next window will have you select the Club to which you are paying dues. (If you have dual membership, remember you need to pay dues to each Club to remain an active member in each Club.)

• Click on the Club, then click on "Save and continue"



- From the drop-down for "Membership Selection", click on "One period", then click on the secure "Checkout".
- A new window appears for you to enter your payment information. Membership renewal for one or two terms (Oct 1, 2024 to Mar 31, 2025 is \$60 or Oct 1, 2024-Sep 30, 2025 is \$120).
- Once you've entered your payment information, click "Submit Payment" at the bottom. Wait for processing.

 If you still need help, reach out to your VP of Membership or Club Treasurer
