LIST OF FUNCTIONARIES FOR A TOASTMASTER SPEECH CONTEST

Contest Officials

1. Contest Chair:

Oversees the entire contest, ensures rules are followed, and introduces the contest proceedings.

2. Chief Judge:

Responsible for organizing and supervising all judges and ensuring contest rules are upheld.

3. Contest Judges:

Evaluate and score contestants' performances based on the speech contest judging criteria. May include:

- Voting Judges (minimum 5, depending on the contest level)
- Tie-breaking Judge (kept confidential)

4. Timers:

Operate timing devices and signal contestants using colored cards or lights to indicate speech time.

5. Ballot Counters:

Collect and tally the judges' ballots, ensuring accuracy in determining winners.

6. Sergeant at Arms (SAA):

Handles room setup, contestant logistics, and ensures contestants are briefed and escorted as needed during the contest.

Support Roles

- 7. **Contest Toastmaster (Master of Ceremonies)**: Conducts the contest, introduces contestants, and manages the flow of the event.
- 8. **Pattern Speaker (for Evaluation Contests)**: Delivers the speech used for evaluation by contestants in an Evaluation Contest.

9. Timer Backup:

Serves as a secondary timer to ensure accuracy and backup in case of equipment failure.

Other Roles (Optional)

10. Zoom Master or Technical Support (for Online Contests):

Handles technical needs such as muting/unmuting, spotlighting speakers, and managing breakout rooms.

11. Hospitality Team:

Welcomes attendees and ensures they have materials or refreshments, depending on the venue.

12. Usher or Greeter:

Assists with guiding attendees to their seats or breakout rooms in virtual contests.

13. Photographer/Videographer:

Captures memorable moments during the contest (if allowed).

14. Audience Management Support:

Helps maintain quiet and appropriate contest conditions.

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
